



Joan talked about the challenge of growing the membership of the Civic League and that about 10% of homes in Camellia Shores are represented at each meeting. In the interest of trying to grow the membership and making it easier to serve on the board there will now be four Civic League meetings a year: March, June (which will be held at the annual picnic), September and December (with a holiday theme).

- -Primary for Commonwealth Attorney General is June 17, 2025 with two candidates: Ramin Fatehi and John Butler.
- -Phil gave flowers to both Joan and Mary and thanked them for their years of service as president and secretary.

Speakers: Tommy Smigiel (Ward 5 City Council) and Ken Paulson (Norfolk School Board Member) Tommy talked about several points of interest affecting our area and the city. HRT has purchased several properties with the intention of building a new transfer station, as Norfolk has the most bus use in the 757 area. They will also be relocating the station near Mary Pretlow Library to make it safer and more visible. –He talked about our property taxes going up because assessed prices have gone up and what our tax money is being used for. The casino is estimated, eventually, to generate \$25-\$30 million in revenue.



Due to military bases 38% of Norfolk land is not taxable.

- --Because of all the new and structurally tall buildings on Shore Drive, a new fire station with a ladder truck is needed in that area.
- -Tommy talked about the problem of salary competition, especially concerning the sheriff and police departments and offering higher salaries for retention of officers.
- -Both Tommy and Ken talked about a large reduction in public school enrollment so there is a plan to close 10-17 schools over the next five years. This will save a lot of tax money by not supporting unneeded buildings and administration for schools with small populations.

Joan adjourned the meeting at 8:30 pm and announced the next meeting will be held Monday, September 8, 2025. Mark your calendars for our kickoff meeting! Guest speakers include city officials running for elected office in November, as well as the Virginia House of Delegates. Your vote counts!

These new businesses in Norfolk are both on the other side of town, but worth the visit. There are lots of places to eat and hang around them, and they are great for an indoor day of play for the whole family.

#### Bogey's 757:

Bogey's 757 in Norfolk's Chelsea district features 18 creative, interactive mini golf holes plus a practice green, all handmade and locally themed by the owner.





Expect unique challenges like foosball, ziplines, pong, and giant propellers. Open Wed-Fri 3-9 PM and Sat-Sun 12-9 PM, admission is \$14 for adults, \$12 for kids under 10, with extra rounds for

\$8. They also offer a golf simulator, party rentals, and are conveniently located next to Smartmouth Brewing Company for food, drinks, and extra games.

#### **Just Birdies:**

Just Birdies in Norfolk's Lambert's Point offers indoor simulator bays for up to six people to play.



There's active sports and carnival games—from golf and zombie dodgeball to baseball, hockey, and more—using real balls for a physical, hands-on experience.

#### **HEUTTE DRIVE UPDATE**

Gabriel Phelps, a City of Norfolk Department of Utilities civil engineer and lead on the Heutte Drive sewer collection system project recently provided an updated timeline. Current work on the sewer main will by completed by the end of October. After that's finished, construction will begin on a pump station, located between 4076 and 4202 Heutte Drive. That phase will wrap up by the end of January.

In February, Mr. Phelps said work will begin on owners' property to ensure plumbing hook ups to the line. That work will be completed by May. A separate pump station for the property at 4001 Heutte is also slated for construction. Lastly, the project area on Heutte Drive will be paved and striped. Barring any weather delays, the target completion date for the entire project is the first week of June. Check our next newsletter for updates, especially when we can expect wastewater treatment charges to begin.
